

## Kansas State Deaf-Blind Fund

FY 2020 - 2021

Students who are deaf-blind present complex and challenging educational needs. The nature of the disability is such that highly specialized consultation, evaluation methods, and technology may be necessary for them to access daily instruction in education settings. A large percentage also have significant intellectual disabilities. Availability and daily use of specialized instructional materials and services, such as positioning equipment, assistive technologies, instructional software, augmentative alternative communication devices, and/or accommodations provide can maximize access to the general education curriculum. As a result, the opportunity for students with deaf-blindness and/or significant intellectual disabilities to learn and achieve alongside their same age peers in preschools, general education classrooms, community and/or vocational settings is increased.

In SFY2021, the amount allocated was \$110,000.00. Each application to the Kansas State Deaf-Blind Fund is reviewed carefully. One criterion for eligibility is the cost of expenditure(s) needs to exceed the amount an LEA has available from local and state categorical funds. The first funding window for priority candidate application was July 1 to October 31. Funding was available and a second application window was opened for students with significant intellectual disabilities, in addition to deaf-blindness January 1st through May 20<sup>th</sup>.

In SFY2021, an unusual number of unforeseen challenges arose when verifying local expenditures before issuing reimbursements. These obstacles can be attributed to the COVID-19 disruptions on local business offices combined with staff turnover. An unusually high number of requests for reimbursement were substantially lower than the amount KSDE approved. KSDE responded by extending due dates, soliciting additional applications, providing technical assistance and accommodating the need of each LEA to every extent practical. As a result, \$95,454.97 was expended and \$14,545.00 remained unobligated.

In SFY2021, a total of 92 deaf-blind fund applications were processed. Expenditures benefitted 76 Kansas children and youth from 32 local districts, cooperatives, interlocals, and/or education service centers.
