APPLICATION DEADLINE: OCTOBER 10, 2024

Whether outspoken or soft spoken, the type of student who thrives during Washington Week is one who is truly interested in government, history, politics and leadership and one who has a demonstrated desire to serve others in a leadership capacity.

The students selected should have experience in public speaking and working with others as part of public and community service activities. High academic achievement, high aspirations for college and career and other clear examples of self-motivation and creativity often define Senate Youth delegates. Being president of student body government is not enough of a qualifier in many cases – additional and often extraordinary examples of a student's passion for service and empathy for others are often better indicators. For inspiration read the <u>student essays</u>¹ on the United States Senate Youth Program (USSYYP) website.

The students selected should be confident and capable of public speaking because a central part of Washington Week are the many Q and A sessions where students are given an unparalleled opportunity to speak directly with the highest-level elected and appointed officials in the country – including the president of the United States.

To apply you must submit the following:

Completed personal information on application.

Official academic transcript with nonweighted grade point average (GPA).

Two letters of support:

One from either the high school principal or a teacher.

One from an adult advisor to the organization or student body entity that they represent confirming the student's leadership position. Their leadership qualities and personal attributes.

Required two written application essays. Word templates are attached for the essays portion. Limit responses to 500 words or less per response.

Signatures of principal and parents.

PLEASE NOTE: Materials received after midnight on application date will be automatically declined for submission for the 2025 program.

- A participant, captain or officer in mock trial, debate team, model united nations or other academic club, mock legislature, conference or competition where the primary engagement is for individual educational benefit.
